Letter from Devlin



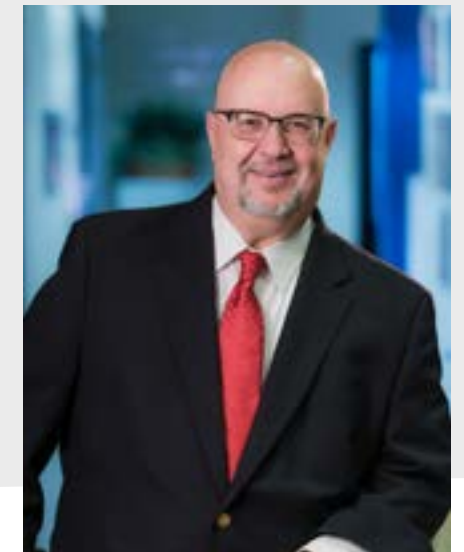

Latin America

Solving for Flavianne's Future

For many children in our programs, camp is one of the highlights of their year. However, a new experience like camp can cause a lot of anxiety for some children, including 12-year-old Flavianne in Brazil.

Flavianne has special needs and wanted to go to camp, but was nervous about the experience because she had never been away from home. Our staff rallied behind her, making a way for her mother to join her at camp. Flavianne felt safe, comfortable, and welcomed at camp and even gave her life to Jesus on the final night of camp! Because of the support and creativity of our program staff, Flavianne's hope and future are now in Christ.



Dominican Republic

- 4 teams came to the DR. They brought Vacation Bible School, fun, fellowship, and new reading centers to 3 of our programs.



Guatemala

- 8 seniors received their high school diploma as the first graduating class in October.
- 5 teams traveled to Guatemala and brought books, Vacation Bible School, and lots of love and fellowship.



Peru

- The Casa Luz Orphanage moved to a brand new facility in early November.



Brazil

- 85 children and youth attended camp after a 3-year hiatus. Several children gave their commitment of faith and 4 were baptized.

Solving for Nancy's Future

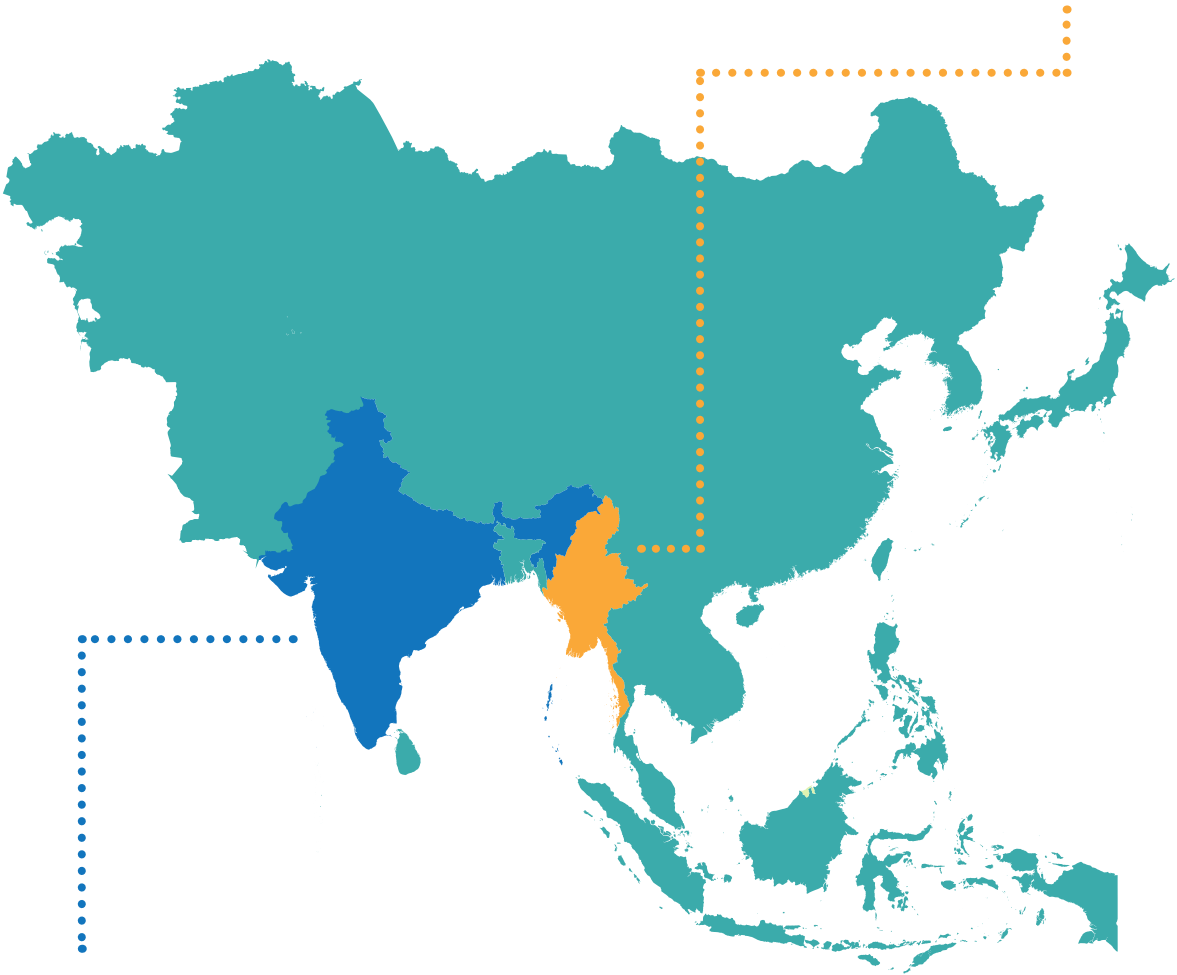
When fifth grader Nancy* first started coming to her VisionTrust Learning Center in Myanmar, she was shy, quiet, and did not have many friends. Her parents, who are not Christian, chose to send Nancy to the Learning Center to get an education, but what she has received is so much more. Because of the support of her teachers at the Learning Center, Nancy has grown in her confidence, made new friends, and works hard at her studies. She has also had opportunities to regularly attend Sunday School and church and hear about the love and goodness of God. Not only is Nancy growing in her education, but also her love for the Lord. She is a light in her community and her family.

Myanmar

- Staff, children, and adolescents have remained safe amid ongoing violence and civil war.
- Vacation Bible School was held for youth over Zoom and water filtration was updated in our programs.



India

- 85% of the high school students successfully passed graduation exams, and all students have returned fully back to school.
- For the first time since 2019, Vacation Bible School was held.

Africa

Solving for Ezechiel's Future

Growing up in a poor neighborhood in Central African Republic with limited access to clean water, electricity, education, and health care, Ezechiel was left with few opportunities. His father was unemployed and going to school seemed unreasonable. Yet, Ezechiel dreamed of more. Thanks to the support of his sponsor and the VisionTrust Learning Center in his community, Ezechiel has defied the odds, worked hard, and obtained his high school diploma. He is now preparing to take his university entrance test and hopes to pursue a degree to become a Building and Public Works Engineer. Thanks to the support he received, Ezechiel can now work toward making a tangible difference in his community, providing access to basic needs that he once lacked and changing the future of his community and those around him.



Liberia

- 8 staff leaders spent a week in literacy training to provide support for all our teachers to help children be better readers.



Central African Republic

- 20 committed volunteers spent time together renewing their understanding of our Spiritual Development training to better serve our children.



Zimbabwe

- 250 children attended camp, as well as board members and pastors from local churches.
- Families in Mavende now have clean water at a pump for the very first time. The community rallied together to dig a trench to deliver the water to the school.



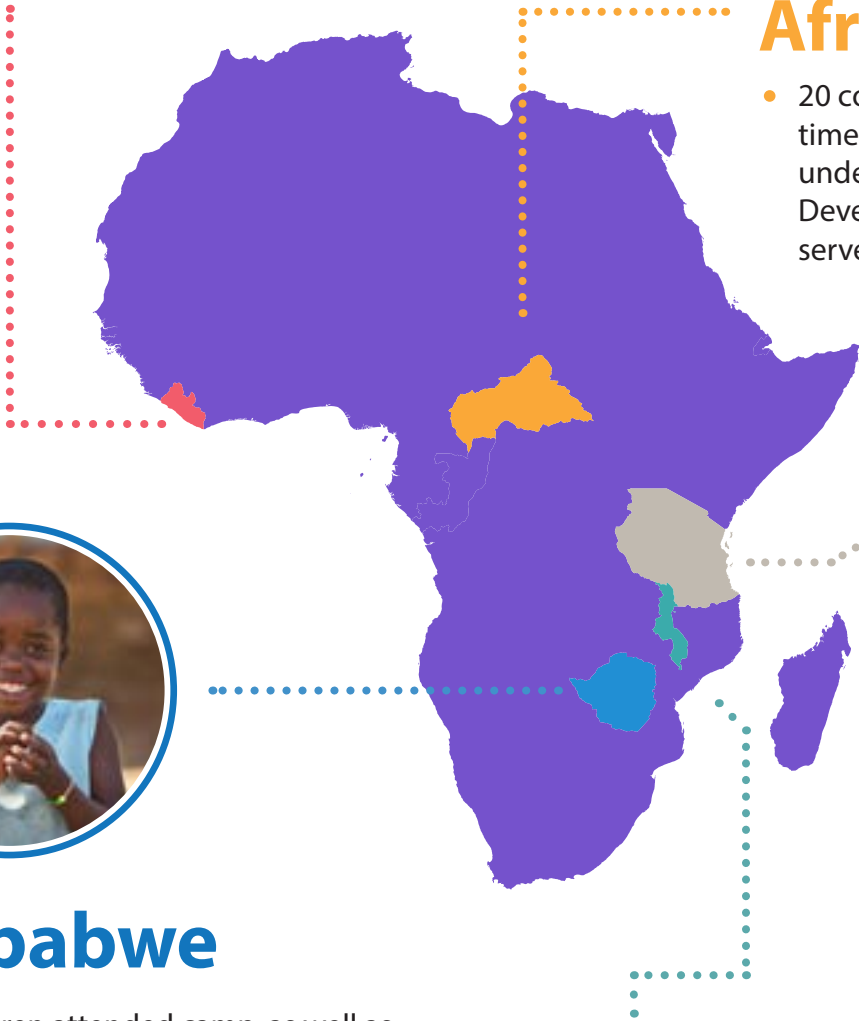
Tanzania

- The second group of students have successfully completed exams and are ready to move on to secondary education.

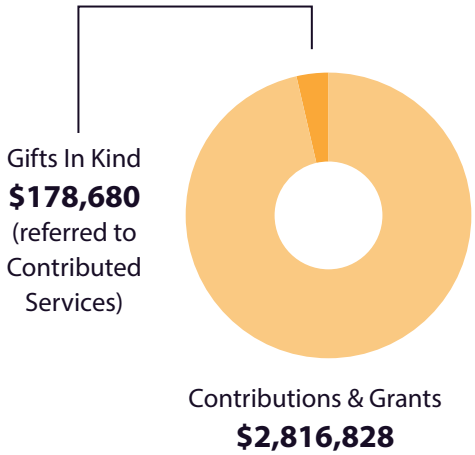

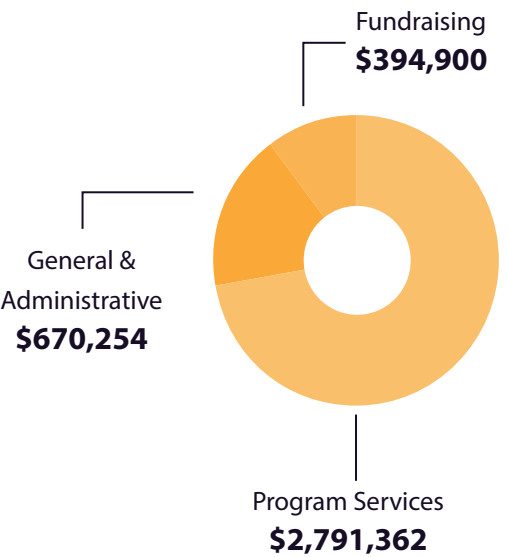

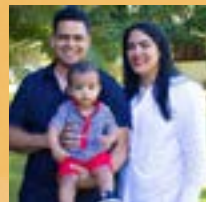
